### Important Notes (A):

**1. Each reference cited in text must appear in the reference list and vice-versa.**

**2. Use only the surname of the author in your in-text reference:**

- ✘ Referring to the work of Andreas Huyssen (1995)...
- ✔ Referring to the work of Huyssen (1995)...
- ✔ In this article we will analyze Andreas Huyssen’s previous work (Huyssen, 2015, 2016, 2020).

Exceptions apply when you cite different authors with the same surname (see below).

**3. When citing two or more works together, arrange the in-text citations alphabetically in the same order in which they appear in the reference list:**

Past research (Gogel, 1990, 2006, in press) demonstrates that...

Recent research in developmental psychology has explored this issue (e.g., Bergstrom et al., 2006; Clément, 2010; Harris & Corriveau, 2011; Harris & Koenig, 2006; Heyman, 2008; Heyman & Legare, in press; Koenig & Harris, 2005).

(Allern & Bale, 2012; Allern et al., 2019) [if the second author’s surname in the Allern et al. citation is after Bale]

(Allern et al., 2019; Allern & Bale, 2012) [if the second author’s surname in the Allern et al. citation is before Bale]

**4. If you want to include several different citations in one set of brackets, they should be in alphabetical order, separated by a semi-colon:**

(Durie, 2003; McShane & Travaglione, 2007; Ministry of Education, 1996)

**5. To cite more than one work by the same author(s), list the surname of the author(s) and then each different year of publication, separated by a comma:**

(Ministry of Education, 1996, 1999)

**For groups of authors with the same lead author and different co-authors, also separate the citations with a comma, unless they have the same year of publication:**

According to previous research (see Whiteley et al., 2010, 2013) there is...

**Styles can be combined:**

(Durie, 2003; Ministry of Education, 1996, 1999; Whiteley et al., 2010)

**6. Quoting two almost identical sets of authors with the same year of publication, spell out as many author names as necessary in the in-text citation to tell them apart:**

**First citation in text:**

(Marewski, Gaissmaier, & Gigerenzer, 2010)

(Marewski, Gaissmaier, Schooler, et al., 2010)

**Subsequent citations in text:**

(Marewski, Gaissmaier, & Gigerenzer, 2010)

(Marewski, Gaissmaier, Schooler, et al., 2010)

Notes: Only use “et al.” if there is **more than one author** missing from the in-text citation. List as many authors as necessary to distinguish between references.

**7. When citing a multi-volume work that has been published over the course of a number of years, use the date range as the publication date in both the in-text citation and reference list:**

**In-text citation:**

(World Health Organization, 2000–2006)

**Entry in references list:**

World Health Organization. (2000–2006). *WHO annual report*.

**8. Citing different authors with the same surname, include the necessary initials before the surname in all in-text citations, regardless of the year of publication:**

(L.-J. Chen, 1993)

(Y. G. Chen, 2001)

(D. Jackson, 2018; M. C. Jackson et al., 2017)

(e.g., Johnson, 1997; H. D. Wu, 1998)

Notes: Never include initials for subsequent authors in in-text citations. Entries in the final list of references are written normally. Names in in-text citations must be organized according to the final list of references.

**9. Citing different authors with the same surname and first name initial, include these authors' full first names in the in-text citations, regardless of the year of publication:**

(Laura Green, 2009)

(Lorenzo Green, 2003)

(Leonard Green & Myerson, 2013)

Notes: Never include the full first name of subsequent authors in in-text citations. Names in in-text citations must be organized according to the final list of references.

**10. When making a general mention to a website (including, but not limited to, social media) it is not required that you include an in-text citation and entry in the references list. Simply add the general URL:**

News agencies like CNN provide breaking news coverage to millions of people every day on their website (<http://www.cnn.com>) and Twitter account (<http://twitter.com/CNN>). In our first investigation, we analyzed the content of CNN's Twitter feed during the year 2012.

**11. When quoting or summarizing a particular passage, include the specific page or paragraph number as well:**

The painting was assumed to be by Matisse (Powell, 1989, Chapter 6), but later analysis showed it to be a forgery (Murphy, 1999, p. 85).

The patient wrote that she was unimpressed by the doctor's bedside manner (Smith, 2006, para. 2)

**12. You should italicize the name of a newspaper, magazine, or journal no matter where they appear in your manuscript, so that it will always be *The Economist*, *New York Times*, etc., both in the text and reference list.**

**13. Use secondary sources sparingly, for instance, when the original work is out of print or unavailable through usual sources. The words "as cited in" in the parenthetical reference indicate you have not read the original research. Always add the original publication date in the in-text citation, unless it is unknown. Only include the secondary source in the reference list; the original work is merely cited in the text.**

- ✘ (Hester & Heglin as cited in Mäkitalo, 2014, pp. 25–26)
- ✔ (Hester & Heglin, 1986, as cited in Mäkitalo, 2014, pp. 25–26)

**14. Always separate in-text citations from parenthetical text with commas around the year and never with squared brackets.**

- ✘ structures (see Ellis et al. [2008] for recent meta-analyses).
- ✔ structures (see Ellis et al., 2008, for recent meta-analyses).

**15. When the in-text citation contains the source for a direct quote (with a page number, if applicable), plus subsequent works, the original source of the quote should be the first to appear in the parenthesis, regardless alphabetical order. To avoid any ambiguity, include "see also" before introducing the remaining works:**

Social support, defined as "a process of using communication and other sorts of behavior to help another person manage problematic integration," is one form of social capital that facilitates coping through uncertainty reduction (Ford et al., 1996, p. 191; see also Albrecht & Adelman, 1987).

**16. For material with unknown authors (e.g., some newspaper articles), use a shortened title (the first three words, or the full title if it is short) in place of the author in in-text citations.**

As discussed in "Economics nudging" (2017), governments...

**17. In in-text citations, the expression "and colleagues" or similar ones cannot be used. Always use "et al."**
